9:40 am	Michael Zarbl talked about the MARR response and support offered after the BC flooding situation happened earlier in November.
	<ul> <li>MARR is closely working with the Regional District of Fraser Valley and the Thompson-Nicola Regional District as well cities of Abbotsford and Chilliwack.</li> <li>MARR and other Stewardships in BC are helping to cover extra labor expenses. Some temporarily transfer stations are set up in Abbotsford to handle the extra volume.</li> <li>MARR is working with the Red Cross and United Way to help people who doesn't have insurance.</li> <li>There are some risks about refurbishing and reusing electronics that has been impacted by the flood.</li> </ul>
9:45 am	Update on Collection Network.
	<ul> <li>A first site in the Central Coast Regional District has signed up with MARR - Bella Bella Recycling Facility.</li> <li>Three sites got inactivated for non-respect of the MARR requirements – no impact for residents as other local/regional/private sites close by are part of the MARR program.</li> <li>A total of 27 Regional Districts are covered by the MARR program, with 199 active MARR sites.</li> <li>The total of units collected is in constant progression: +7% compared to 2020, that brings a total of 350,966 units collected in 2021 as of December 13, 2021.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>The MARR field agent is continuously visiting sites to offer any support and evaluate the collection system. In 2021, 81 sites have been visited.</li> <li>The agent is also fully certified and can provide an ODS removal practice training to any community or remote site that do not have easy access to certified ODS technician. 3 sites have taken part of this training.</li> </ul>

9:50 am	Training at the Heiltsuk First Nation.
	<ul> <li>This community organized a collection event earlier this year, before becoming a MARR site in November.</li> <li>Following the completion of the online HRAI course, 6 employees have been trained by the MARR field agent for the ODS removal practice.</li> <li>Around 100 fridges &amp; freezers have been serviced during the training.</li> <li>Training is free of charge</li> </ul>
9:54 am	Mercury Switch / PCB Capacitors Program.
	<ul> <li>643 mercury switches recycled in 2021.</li> <li>10 PCB capacitors recycled in 2021 (previously used in air conditioners until 1979).</li> <li>The MARR field agent helped and trained 21 ODS technicians to recognize PCB capacitors and mercury switches, and safely collect them.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>MARR is helping remote communities to dispose of Large Appliances.</li> <li>8 collection events have been held in 2021.</li> </ul>
9:58 am	Chris Campbell provided an update on the stewardship plan renewal.
	<ul> <li>Consolidated all feedbacks received after the two consultations organized in October (live and webinar)</li> <li>Several follow-up consultations will be scheduled in early 2022.</li> </ul>
10:00 am	Andrew Doi from Metro Vancouver provided his feedback on illegal dumping issue.
	<ul> <li>Some large appliances and electronics are dumped or abandoned on the streets, those need to be collected and recycled at the proper facility.</li> <li>Cost issue involved for local governments and remote communities.</li> </ul>
10:02 am	Andrew Doi raised an issue of the future response to nature disaster. Extensive discussion ensued.
	<ul> <li>Proposition to come up with a formal plan on emergency procedure.</li> <li>Michael Zarbl to approach SABC group and introduce the Coordination of Stewardship programs in BC to help local governments.</li> </ul>
10:13 am	Marketing plan for consumer awareness for the next year.
	• MARR has some new creative assets that will be used in 2022 to promote that: "Recycling Large Appliances is crucial to keep BC green, easy and free".
10:14 am	Darren Murray provided his feedback on the MARR program:
	<ul> <li>Program is working very well for the residents of the Regional District of North Okanagan (RDNO)</li> <li>Easy reporting requirements</li> <li>Positively commented on implementation of mercury switches and PCB capacitors to the program</li> <li>In 2021, 4300 refrigerated appliances were decommissioned at the RDNO which represents a 16% increase compared to last year. During summer 2021 twice as many large appliances were collected compared to summer 2020</li> </ul>
10:18 am	Michael Zarbl mentioned an increase in the budget for public awareness.
	<ul> <li>To let everyone know that there is no cost for dropping units at a MARR site.</li> <li>Majority of the sites are in a 20 km range</li> <li>Collection Events</li> </ul>
